Examples of permits required by these industries are dealer permits and alcoholic beverage control (ABC) licenses. Guarantee loans are financial collateral agreements that ensure that the company complies with state regulations and/or contractual obligations. This is often needed for certain types of companies, such as construction companies. Revers also said that federally regulated industry companies often have to fill out licensing forms with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Federal Maritime Commission or the U.S. Department of Transportation. Because the licensing you need varies from state to state, city, and industry, contact the relevant authorities and legal counsel to understand the specific requirements. How much does a business license cost? The cost of accessing or permitting your business depends on a number of factors, including the type of license, your location, handling fees, and recurring fees. For example, the cost of a Nevada state business license can be \$500 a year, as well as fees for filing annual officer and director lists. Fees for industry-specific and local licenses can range from a few dollars to a few thousand dollars, either once or continuously, Gilmer said. For budgeting purposes, business owners should do their homework and contact the relevant agencies as part of the planning process, rather than suffering from sticker shock when applying for a license reactively or at short notice.
